
Practical Information | 2nd GOBEYOND Workshop - Napoli, Italy

The **2nd GOBEYOND Workshop** will be held in **Napoli (Italy)** on **21-22 April 2026**. The event is designed as an interdisciplinary and practice-oriented forum to advance the development and uptake of the **GOBEYOND Multi-Risk Impact-Based Early Warning System**, with a strong emphasis on operational readiness and stakeholder engagement.

Across three days, the workshop will address **key challenges** in early warning and emergency response through high-level round tables on:

- Impact-based early warnings and rapid response for seismic risk,
- Monitoring and local response strategies for rainfall-induced landslides,
- Management of complex, interacting multi-risk scenarios,
- Early warning for tsunamis and volcanic eruptions, from simulation to operations.



Dedicated sessions will bridge the gap **from early warning to action**, highlighting site-specific implementations and governance frameworks that enable effective local decision-making. Participants will also engage in **poster sessions, live demonstrations, and hands-on exhibitions**, presenting operational prototypes developed for multiple European and international pilot sites, including urban, coastal, volcanic, and mountainous environments.

The programme is complemented by a session dedicated to the ongoing volcanic unrest at Campi Flegrei caldera with an associated **field trip** offering direct insight into integrated monitoring, risk communication, and emergency management in one of Europe's most complex volcanic regions.

Venue

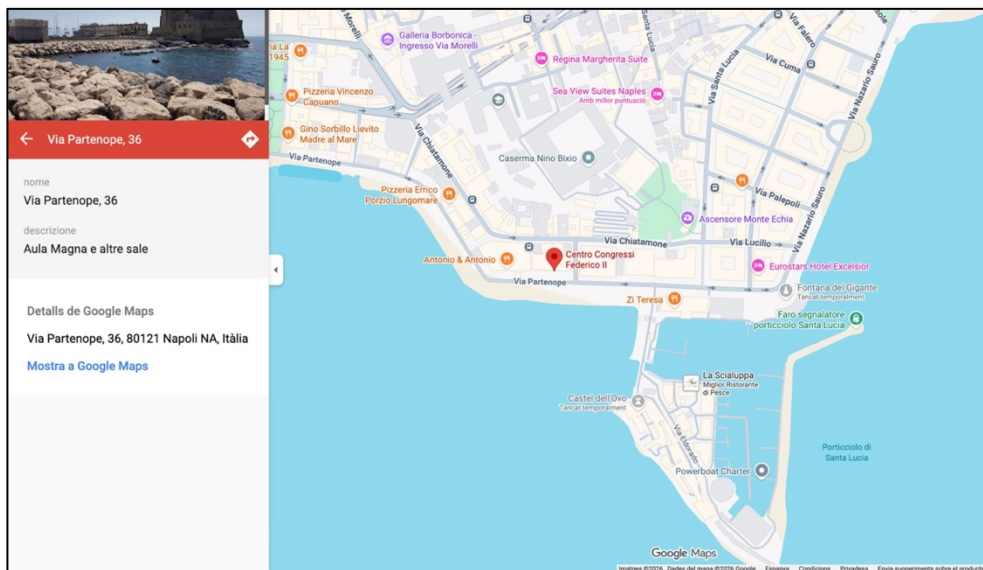
The workshop will be held at the **Centro Congressi of the Università degli Studi di Napoli Federico II (Aula Magna)**, located at **Via Partenope, 36**, on the Napoli seafront, directly in front of Castel dell'Ovo.

Napoli has a comprehensive public transportation network, with several buses and metro stops conveniently located near the venue. If you plan to reach Centro Congressi **by metro**, the following lines provides access to nearby stops.

- **Line 1 (Metro 1):** The nearest stop is Municipio, approximately a 23-minute walk from the Centro Congressi.
- **Line 2 (Trenitalia Linea 2):** The nearest stop is Piazza Amedeo, about a 25-minute walk away.
- **Line 6 (Metro 6):** The nearest stops are San Pasquale (17 minutes on foot) and Chiaia-Monte Di Dio (14 minutes on foot).

If you prefer to travel **by bus**, several bus lines stop at Piazza Vittoria, which is just a 7-minute walk from the Centro Congressi. The bus lines serving this stop include:

- **151, 128, 140, R7**



How to get to Naples from the airport

Naples is served by [Naples International Airport \(Capodichino\)](#), which is located approximately **7 km from the city center**.

To travel from **Naples Capodichino Airport to Napoli Centrale - Train Station** or to the **city center**, you can take a **taxi** or the [Alibus shuttle service](#).

- **Ticket Price:** 5 € (valid for a single journey)
- **Frequency:** Every **15 minutes**, from **05:30 AM to 23:55 PM**
- **Tickets:** Available **on board**, **automatic ticketing machines** at the arrival terminal exit or **online**.

Once at **Napoli Centrale**, you can reach your final destination via:

- **Metro:** Line 1 connects the central station to key areas in Naples.
- **Taxi:** Available at the main exit of the station.
- **Public buses:** Various local buses operate from the station to different parts of the city.

Miscellaneous

Napoli, the third largest city in Italy, situated at the foot of Mount Vesuvius and directly on the gulf of Napoli, offers a wealth of cultural and historical attractions to be explored.

Historic centre of Naples

The historic centre of Naples is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Walking along Spaccanapoli, the long street that cuts through the old town, you'll discover centuries-old churches, hidden courtyards, artisan workshops. Highlights include Napoli Cathedral (Duomo), home to the relics of San Gennaro, Santa Chiara Monastery with its beautiful majolica cloister, and San Domenico Maggiore, a key site of medieval Naples.

Underground Naples

Beneath the streets lies another city, *Napoli Sotterranea* and *the Catacombs of San Gennaro* and *San Gaudioso* reveal Greek and Roman tunnels, ancient aqueducts, burial chambers, and early Christian art. These sites show how Naples has continuously reused and built upon its past for over 2,000 years.

Castles and Seafront

Naples has several impressive castles: *Castel Nuovo (Maschio Angioino)* dominates the port area and reflects the city's medieval and Renaissance power; *Castel Sant'Elmo* is a striking medieval fortress perched on the Vomero hill, offering the best panoramic view of Naples, the Bay, and Mount Vesuvius; *Castel dell'Ovo*, located on the sea, still offers panoramic views of the Bay of Naples and Mount Vesuvius—especially beautiful at sunset. The nearby *Lungomare* promenade is perfect for a scenic walk by the water.

Museums and Art

Art lovers should not miss the *National Archaeological Museum of Naples (MANN)*, one of the most important archaeological museums in the world, housing extraordinary artifacts from Pompeii and Herculaneum. *The Capodimonte Museum*, set in a former royal palace, contains masterpieces by Caravaggio, Titian, and Raphael, along with stunning views over the city.
